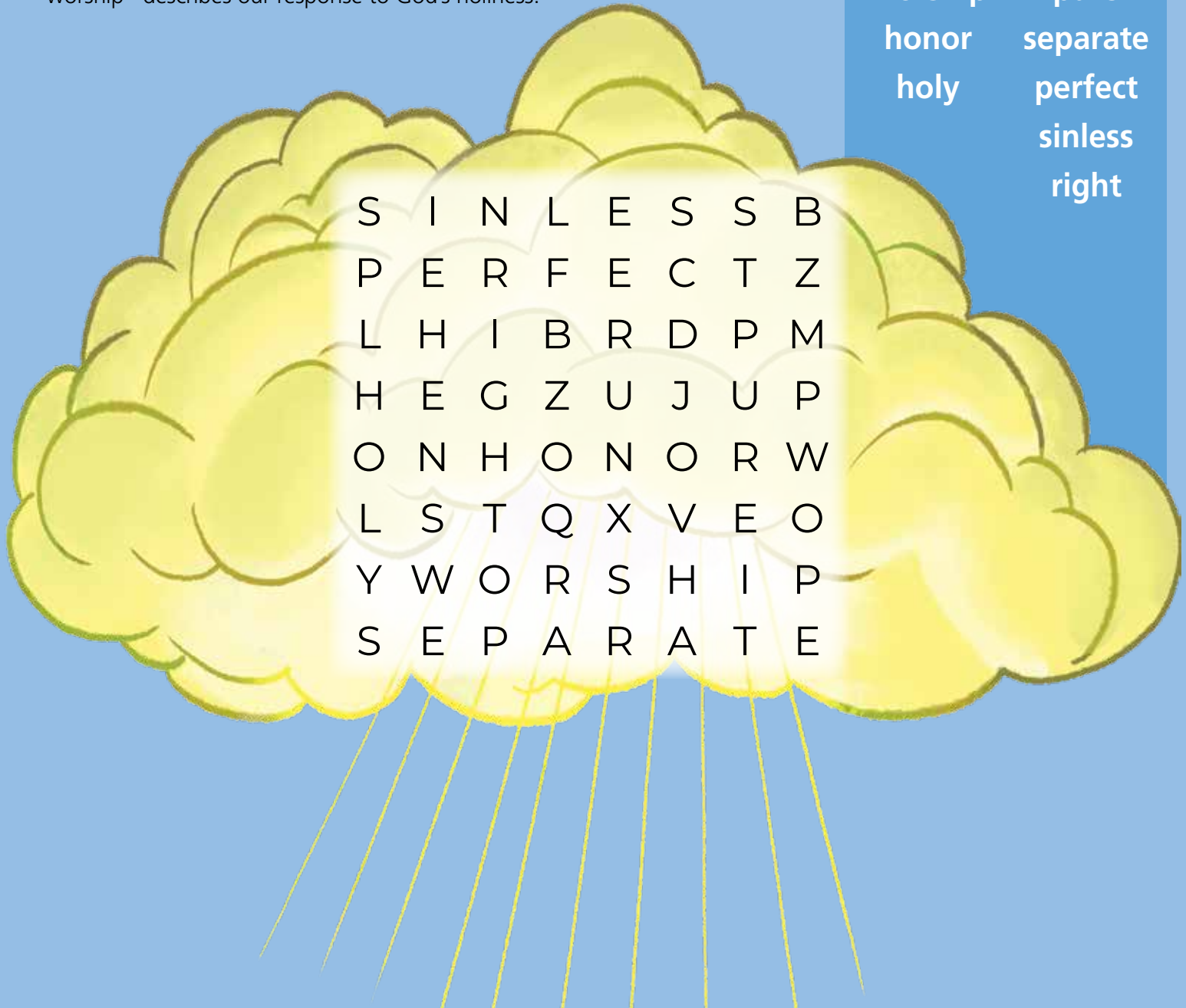

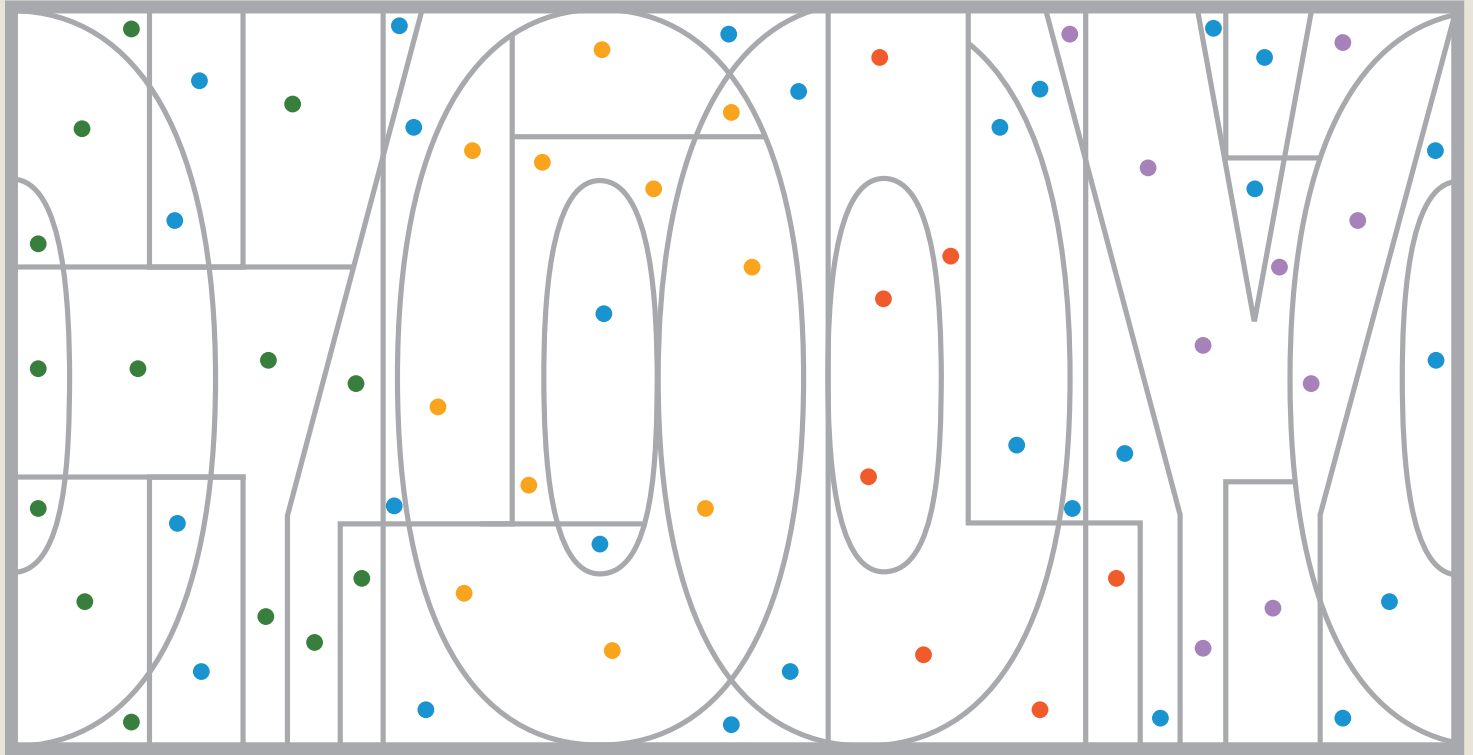
Growing at Home

God Is Holy

Leviticus 19:2; Isaiah 6:1–5; 14:12–15;
Ezekiel 28:13–19



Long before God created the earth, God created thousands and thousands of angels. The angels lived in Heaven with God, worshiping and serving Him.

One angel was more beautiful than all the other angels. His name was Lucifer.

Because Lucifer was so beautiful and wise, he became proud. Lucifer wanted to be even greater than God. He thought all the angels should worship him instead of God.

When Lucifer became prideful and selfish, he sinned against God. So God punished Lucifer by casting him out of Heaven. Lucifer's name was changed to Satan.

God had to punish Lucifer's sin because God is holy. "Holy" means completely perfect and pure, or without sin. Because God is holy, He cannot tolerate sin. Satan could no longer be in God's presence in Heaven because he had sinned.

Satan wanted to be worshiped over God. But only God deserves to be worshiped because He is holy. God is the ruler and creator of everything!

As we read the Bible, we learn about how pure God is. Then we realize how sinful we are. We need a Savior to save us from being punished for our sin.

One man, a prophet named Isaiah, got to see a glimpse of God's holiness. Isaiah immediately realized he could never measure up to God's holiness and said, "Woe is me!"

When we realize how sinful we are, we should worship God for His holiness. We should thank Him for sending His holy Son, Jesus, to die for our sin.

Because of Jesus' sacrifice, you can be pure and blameless in God's sight. If you confess your sins to God and put your trust in Jesus' blood as payment for sin, God forgives you. And when God forgives you, you are promised a home in Heaven with Him forever! ■
