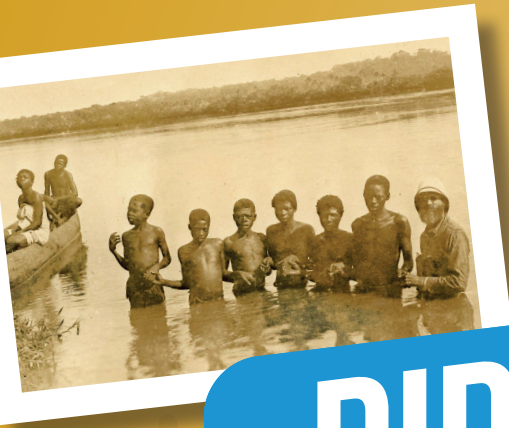

# Speakers



**R. Albert Mohler Jr.** is an American evangelical theologian and influential leader within the Southern Baptist Convention. Since 1993, he has served as the ninth president of The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky—the flagship seminary of the SBC and one of the largest

theological institutions in the world.

Widely recognized as a leading voice in conservative evangelicalism, Mohler has helped shape theological education and public engagement with cultural issues from a distinctly Christian worldview. In addition to his role as seminary president, he is a prolific author, speaker, and commentator, hosting the daily podcast *\*The Briefing\** and participating in national conversations on religion, ethics, and public life.

Through his long tenure at Southern Seminary, Mohler has emphasized doctrinal conviction, pastoral training, and the authority of Scripture, influencing generations of pastors, missionaries, and church leaders around the world.



**Jeremy Kimble** is passionate about teaching college and graduate students the truth of God's Word. His hope is that through his courses, students will grow in their love for God and others, rightly understand the grand narrative of Scripture, and apply theological truths to everyday life. Dr. Kimble is committed to teaching

in the classroom, mentoring students, and speaking in church, camp, and conference settings. He served in pastoral ministry for eight years and is currently an active member and minister at University Baptist Church. Dr. Kimble's academic interests include biblical and systematic theology, ecclesiology, preaching and teaching, and the mission of the church.



**Thomas White** has served as President of Cedarville University, leading with a passion for biblical truth, academic excellence, and discipleship. The son and grandson of Baptist pastors, he earned his MDiv and PhD in systematic theology from Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary and previously taught

at Southwestern Seminary. Under his leadership, Cedarville has grown in enrollment, programs, and facilities. Dr. White focuses on mentoring students and raising biblically faithful leaders. He is the author of a three-volume series on James Madison Pendleton and lives in Cedarville, Ohio, with his wife, Joy, their two children, and their dogs.



As the national representative for the GARBC, **Clare Jewell** is focused on a movement of churches proclaiming God's Word, pursuing God's mission, and prioritizing relationships with God and one another.

Clare also serves as executive director of ABWE's EveryEthnē. His primary focus is mobilizing the church to reach every ethnic group in North America. He believes every person needs to be in a life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ.

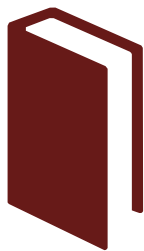

How to leave a legacy of faith- Gen Z is the least religious generation according to Pew Research, and it's no mystery as to why. Today only 4% of Christians have a biblical worldview and those that do follow Christ struggle to know how to disciple the next generation. It's time to take back ground for the Kingdom. 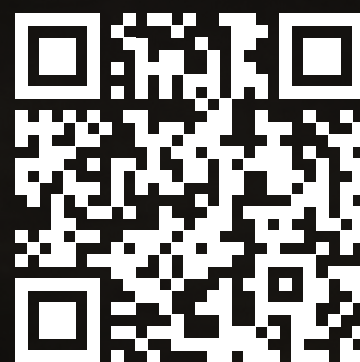
