GREAT N. Y. RALLY OF REGULAR BAPTISTS



YOUNG BAPTISTS ALIVE FOR CHRIST

Rally of Indiana and Southern Michigan Young People Full of Spirit of Christ

[Editor's Note—The day was cold and uninviting. The roads were like sheets of ice. One had to crawl along if driving, and the same if walking But they came from all over Indiana, and from Ohio and Michigan. One carload of young people was in an accident. The protecting Power of God kept them from serious injury. They had come all the way from Ohio, some 200 miles.

The warmth and genuine fellowship made up for the inclement weather. Those young people were there for something. They wanted to learn more about Christ. They wanted to meet other young people who loved and worshipped the same Lord and Saviour Why the banquet alone with the "popcorn" testimony meeting following was worth coming a long way to enjoy. Tell the person who says "young people can't have a good time being out-and-out for Christ," he doesn't know what he is talking about!

On Friday afternoon and evening, November 29th, a live and enthusiastic group of young people met at the First Baptist Church of Mishawaka, Indiana, of which Dr. M. E Hawkins is the pastor. About a year ago this group was organized under the direction of Dr. R. T. Ketcham, pastor of the Central Baptist Church of Gary.

AN INTERVIEW WITH A MODERNIST

Fundamental Young People Interrogate Franklin College (Baptist) Head

[Editor's Note - Several Fundamental young people attended the State B Y. P U. Convention held in Grand Rapids the latter part of November. The following is a conversation held between one of these young people and Dr Wm. Gear Spencer, President of Franklin College, Ind. It sets forth clearly what those believe and teach who have taken the Modernist position. It is sad indeed that this school, founded by Baptists, and with money given too, by those who believed in the Book, the Blood, and the Blessed Hope, has for its head one who takes such a stand as he does.]

Question: "Do you believe that the Lord Jesus Christ died for you personally?"

Dr Spencer: "Well, He died for the whole world, and I suppose that includes me"

Question: "I believe that Jesus Christ shed His blood for me, personally, when He died on the Cross? Do you believe this?"

Dr. Spencer: "I don't suppose Christ could die without shedding blood, but to me the fact that Christ has risen and is now on the right hand of God and able to bring us to Him bears more significance than the incident that occurred 2,000 years ago. The cross was just a means to the end."

Questicn: "Just as Christ ascended unto the Father by the way of the Cross, so do sinners have to come by the way of the Cross. 'Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin' How, in your estimation, can one obtain salvation?"

Dr Spencer: "By accepting Christ and by trying to live up to His ideals."

Question: "Then, don't you believe in salvation through the Blood alone?"

Dr. Spencer: "Shibboleth! It is just a difference of the place of emphasis. You stress the blood, and we stress the moral attributes that can be developed within the individual" When we told him how our church had been forced to get out of the Northern Baptist Convention several years ago because we refused to support the program which embodied communism, socialism, and modernism, he replied, "This talk about communism and socialism is just a smoke screen thrown up by those who are opposed to the N. B. C. I have not seen the slightest indication of it myself." (Being right in the thick of it he probably doesn't recognize it as such.)

In short, during most of the interview, he would find out first where we stood and what we believed, and then very politely agree with us, always qualifying our statements and Scriptures we used with some explanation of his own.

The program was opened by Dr. Hawkins. Brother Katterjohn of Fayette, Ohio, was to have charge of the song service, but word was received just prior to the service that his group had met with an accident about thirty miles outside of Mishawaka In the absence of Brother Katterjohn, Calvin Beukema, Director of Young People's work at Wealthy Street Baptist Temple, Grand Rapids, took charge

Inspirational talks were given by Miss Gertrude Bloomer of Mishawaka, Miss Irene Cochrane of Michigan City, and Brother Stowell of Gary, formerly of Hancock. All of these were splendid spiritual messages, and why? Because they were filled with the praise of One Who "loved us and gave Himself for us." Several solos were sung, and a boy's quintette, from the Central Baptist Church of Gary, gave a number.

The main speaker for the afternoon was Rev. David Otis Fuller of the Wealthy St. Baptist Temple, Grand Rapids.

At six a dinner was served, and what a time of fellowship we had! Following the meal Miss Ethel Burden, choir director of the First Church, led in a number of choruses with Mr. Beukema at the piano A testimony meeting followed, and nearly every one responded telling what the Lord had done for them.

This was no prearranged program, but seldom do you see a group of young people so filled with the Spirit of the Lord.

The evening service was in charge of Dr. Hawkins, and the song serin charge of Brother Katterjohn. The Mishawaka choir rendered a number. There were also several solos. A telegram was read from Dr. R. F. Ketcham who wished the group well, and expressed his regret for not being able to be present. Brother Fuller again gave a very inspiring message taken from Col. 2:9 His theme was 'THE GREATEST QUESTION EVER ASKED'

Groups represented were from Mishawaka, Michigan City, Gary, Bronson, LaPorte, Linton, South Bend, the South Bend Rescue Mission, and Grand Rapids. At the close of the meeting an invitation was given to combine the Michigan and Indiana groups for a conference to be held in Grand Rapids at the Wealthy Street Temple some time during 1936

We trust that the fellowship of these young people will grow, and that many more who have been less fortunate will be able to enjoy this great fellowship next year if the Lord tarries.

ANSWERS TO EXCUSES OF-FERED FOR SUPPORTING THE DEVIL'S GAME

Note: The Devil's Excuse Factory is working 24 hours a day to supply "pious" excuses to Fundamentalists who want to justify themselves for helping him play his game. Here are some sample excuses:

1. "Well, I do not give very much." I asked a Christian woman, "Would you give 5e to support boot-

legging?" Instantly, and with much emphasis, she replied, "I should say I would not!" Then I inquired, "Why do you give even 5e to support Modernism?" Modernism is bootleg religion, and is a million times more ruinous than bootleg liquor. When you give 5c to the denominational missionary budget, corrupted as it is by Modernism, you help Modernism just that much Giving 5c is just the same in principle as if you gave a million dollars.

2. "Well, anyway, I am not a Modernist, and I am preaching the Truth'' Stop and think a minute, my brother, and you will recognize that orthodoxy is vastly more than words It has to do not only with your mouth, but also with your hands, and with your feet, and with your pocketbook It involves not only what you say, but also with whom you are holding hands, and with whom you are walking. When you support Modernism, you are upholding the hands of the workers of iniquity, and are walking in the company of the ungodly. The time is long past when any pastor can plead ignorance of his fellowship and support of Modernism when he supports the denominational missionary budget. And Satan is pleased to have you comfort yourself by reflecting on what you believe and preach, for thereby you salve your conscience about helping him play his game. The denominational leaders care little about what you preach, as long as you continue to support the budget In their eyes, the only "unpardonable sin" is to expose their alliance with Modernism and refuse to support it. They will tolerate your orthodoxy, if you will go on supporting them in their evil

3 "God is blessing the ministry of so-and-so, who is supporting the denominational budget, and God would not bless him if he were doing wrong" That is human reasoning. but is not the Word of God Our Lord Jesus told us that God "maketh His sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sendeth rain on the just and on the unjust." (Matt 5:45.) God used Samson, but that does not mean that God endorsed the character of Samson or all of his acts. God blessed and used David, but that docs not mean that God approved of David's sin with the wife of Uriah! David suffered for that and every child of God who knowingly goes on supporting Modernism by contributing to the denominational budget, will suffer the loss of God's approval and 1eward

OUT! OUT! DARK SPOT!

Jealousy put Joseph in the pit and deported him into Egypt as a common slave. Jealousy crucified the Son of God between two thieves. Jealousy has raised more hell than any other sin known to man.

The "dark spot" among Christians these days is jealousy. It wrecks homes and churches, ruins lifelong friendships, and divides the camp of Christ to the four winds of heaven. One minister jealous of another; one saint of God envious of an office another holds. Take the average "church split." Trace down the motivating cause and nine times out of ten it is jealousy.

Can we afford as Blood-bought children of the King to be jealous of one another? Can we afford to sulk if someone else is given the preeminence that we coveted? It is natural for us to be jealous, but brethren we are "NEW CREATIONS IN CHRIST JESUS—HEIRS OF GOD AND JOINT HEIRS WITH CHRIST!"

Our time is short here at best. Why waste it by casting envious eyes toward another Christian, or laying plans to wreck another's ministry just because he's having success in winning souls and God is blessing? Let us "REDEEM THE TIME—THE DAYS ARE EVIL." Forget self; crucify it on Calvary. As Professor Hitchcock, the great theologian, told his students many years ago, "Gentlemen, be sure the candle of your life has been lighted for Jesus Christ. When it is, then burn to the socket!"

Don't Lose Your Head

The Corinthian Christians had all but lost theirs and Paul closes his first letter to them with the words, "Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong"

There is abundant opportunity for Christians these days to lose their heads. Events, terrifying events, happening in such rapid-fire succession, challenge the Blood-bought Believer to cling that much closer to Calvary

The world is ever famous for losing its head. The suicide toll this past year, the death toll on the highways (36,000 killed and 1,000,000 injured!), the murders committed in the heat of lust or hate (from 1930 to 1933 45,000 homicides in this country alone), all of this is proof enough that "the children of this world" lose very quickly whatever mental balance they might possess

Our Lord said, "In the world ye shall have tribulation; but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world". As children of the King travelling toward the Gloryland, it is befitting for us to keep our heads, even though all around us are losing theirs. Increased faith in Him alone can help us do it, keep us from preaching a loosided Gospel, keep us from going off on a spiritual tangent, and keep us everlastingly proclaiming by lips and life the faithful saying, "Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am chief."

"I'M A PACIFIST!" AFFIRMS NBC HEAD

President Franklin Meets with Opposition However in his Pacifistic Propaganda at Grand Rapids Conference

At the last afternoon session held, of the Michigan State B Y P U Convention, a set of resolutions was presented for discussion and adoption. The resolutions dealing with war and peace were deliberately framed as pacifistic propaganda.

There were a few young people at the session who had backbone enough to stand up and protest. In the end the resolutions were altered considerably from their original state

Much of the propaganda issuing from Moscow at the present time has to do with Pacifism. Communism is forever harping on "pacifism," anxious to have the nations disarm while the Soviets continue their preparations to overthrow governments

We are for peace, but thank God we are not pacifists There is a vast difference between the two As we stated in a previous article (See December issue Bulletin) there can be no peace until the Prince of Peace comes. It is a fool's cry in these days to advocate America disarming Those who advocate this would never for a moment say we should abolish police officials, yet there is the same principle involved in both

Here is the President of the NBC touring the country in the interests of Baptist youth And what is he doing Giving forth a lot of vapid nonsense about "pacifism" and inoculating Baptist young people with the deadly virus of Modernism And still—the slumber of the Baptist layman, and minister, is undisturbed!

The reason he gives may be one of his reasons, but is it the only one? Is it the primary one?

We believe there was something else other than this which caused Mr. Rockefeller to stop giving to a cause which has been his first consideration for years. Surely a man would not

stop giving to a cause in which he had invested \$30,000,000, and had been actively associated with, for such an inconsequential reason

Though it is only our opinion, we believe Mr Rockefeller took this step because the NBC had embraced not only Modernism in all its deadly forms but also Communism, its twin sister. He notified the NBC March 7th last. When did the great Belden Ave Baptist Church of Chicago withdraw from the NBC? The 20th of February last. And why? Dr. Fulton withdrew with his church because of the communistic propaganda, and socialistic and modernistic teachings of the convention. He proved his point with facts on record.

Just about that time things were getting warm in Rochester, New York, where Dr. Strathearn, Secretary of the IEA, a Baptist fellowship, forced the rescinding of a sociocommunistic action taken by a local Baptist association. Dr. W. B. Riley of Minneapolis, a veteran of 40 years in the denomination, at a great gathering in Detroit, exposed the whole scheme in a message entitled "Bloodless—but Red." He revealed that the whole social action passed upon by the NBC was "red" from start to finish.

A friend of ours has a summer home quite near to a home owned by Mr Rockefeller, Jr., in Maine. He has talked informally with him upon several occasions as they have had occasion to meet This friend said that "Mr. Rockefeller just doesn't know what it's all about," that is when it comes to honest-to-goodness Christianity, the Blood of Christ, the Death of Christ for sinners. That is the reason why he is not more discriminating in his gifts, BUT we be lieve that Mr. Rockefeller, Jr., is a red-blooded American enough to repudiate and cast out this hydrabeaded monster of Communism, which is rearing its ugly head not only within the confines of this nation but within the professing church of Christ! Who would know better than Mr Rockefeller that Communism strikes at capitalists such as himself.

We ask the Baptist denomination here and now, not the leaders—"let them alone, they are blind, leaders of the blind"—but the rank and file of Baptists who are still Americans in principle and practice, who still love religious freedom and liberty of con-

My dear Dr Pierce:

Your letter under date of November 29th has just been received You say that you do not know why I should send you the copy of the letter as I did.

The reason is quite palpable. I sent it to apprize you of the situation as existing here in the State of Michigan, knowing your interest in Baptists throughout the country

I was fairly certain that I would receive such a reply as I did from you You say in your letter: "The first paragraph on the top of page two is an absolute falsehood, if not worse." Let me quote it to refresh our minds:

"Then too, I do not believe that there would be anything in common between the two groups, our Church and your Association, because of the fact that the N. B. C. HAS GONE ON RECORD AS ENDORSING AND PROMOTING A SOCIALISTIC AND COMMUNISTIC PROGRAM."

Your good friend, Dr W B Riley, of the First Baptist Church of Minneapolis, in a masterly address this past summer in Detroit, brought out very clearly, with facts to support the charges, that the whole social action program as passed by the N B C was, to quote his own words, "blood-

less but red." It is the most vicious attack upon the Gospel of Jesus Christ, which the N B. C professes to proclaim, that has been released since the blasphemous laymen's report which the Convention juggled with and "pussy-footed" about, and sanctioned, in action if not in word, at their meeting in Washington in May of 1933

I say it kindly, Dr Pierce, but I say it plainly, and that is that there is but one thing that you need, and that is to wake up to the facts which you refuse to face You, with others in the Denomination, Fundamentalists? "Yes." Trusting in the blood of Christ? "Yes," but "running along with the prophets of Baal"

The motto of Stephen Decatur, slightly transposed, fits your case perfectly. "May our Denomination in her intercourse with other Denominations be always right; but our Denomination right or wrong"

Tell me, Doctor, why in the name of all that's Christian, did you allow yourself to be named as one of the representatives from the NB. C to sit in on the Federal Council of Churches of America? Have you never read the Scriptures: "Shouldest thou help the ungodly, and love them that hate the Lord? therefore is wrath upon thee from before the Lord" II Chron 19:2

"Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness? And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel? ... Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord" II Cor. 6:14-17.

May I say again, kindly, that your attitude and your presence as a professed Bible-believing Baptist among the Modernists of the N B C does more harm than any ten outspoken Modernists who have no use for the blood of Christ, His resurrection, and the other great Fundamentals of our faith Sincerely yours.

INSPIRING FELLOWSHIP OF CALIF. CHURCHES

The Association of Regular Baptist Churches held its semi-annual session on November 8 to 10 with the Baptist Church of Altadena, which is an eastern suburb of Pasadena Rev. John Carlos Derfelt, formerly pastor at Cerea and now doing good work as an evangelist, had been elected Moderator at the April session and continued as Moderator at this meeting.

The first service, on Friday evening, was a Young People's Rally The house was crowded with an enthusiastic and earnest assembly of young people. The principal address was given by Rev. Sherman Lemmon of San Dimas, who closed with an earnest appeal which brought several young people to the front.

Saturday was full of business and earnest addresses. The suggestion of incorporating the association did not meet with unanimous approval and so was not adopted Two additional Churches were received into fellowship making a total of twentyseven Churches now in the associa-These Churches extend from tion San Diego to San Francisco Rev. L. S. Mercado introduced to us a full blooded Yaqui Indian, the first and perhaps the only convert from that tribe Sunday was a day of preaching and devotion.

The association is now in its seventh year of existence. Seven years ago the writer hereof began visiting the scattered independent Baptist Churches with the suggestions that an association be formed Five pastors, meeting in Modesto, sponsored the call for messengers from the churches to effect such an organization. The response was immediate and hearty The seven years have been happy and fruitful In addition to the 27 churches now composing the association there are at least as many more who will ultimately be numbered with us.

We California brethren also claim an important part in the formation of the General Association. It was in the same city of Modesto, when the association was in session, that Rev G R Dye wrote out a resolution on the back of an old envelope and moved its adoption. Here it is:

Modesto, California, November 9, 1931

"To Oliver W. Van Osdel, D. D. Wealthy St. Baptist Temple, Grand Rapids.

"Dear Brother Van Osdel:

We, the association of Regular Baptist Churches of California, believe that it would greatly advance the Lord's cause at our hands if the various associations of independent Baptists in the United States were brought together in some form of national organization expressing a common fellowship and purpose.

"We believe that you are, Dr. Van Osdel, the proper convener of a national meeting of representative Baptists for the purpose of forming such a national assembly. We hereby request you to confer with all other independent bodies of Baptists and, if possible, arrange such a meeting at such time and place as may seem best."

Dr. Van Osdel, now of sainted memory, printed our resolution in his "Temple News" and proceeded accordingly to convene a representative meeting in Chicago out of which came our General Association of Regular Baptist Churches. The larger fellowship has already, by reflex action, brought a blessing to us on the west coast. It is the old story of comfort and courage from the seven thousand who have not bowed the knee to Baal
