### WHY AN ASSOCIATION?

In answering the question as to the reason for a General Association of Regular Baptist Churches, we must point first of all to the basic cause for churches withdrawing their fellowship from the Northern Baptist Convention.

The basic cause is Modernism. In the Convention, an inclusive policy operating in every department, gives recognition of, and representation to, the modernistic system, as well as,-and in many cases in preference to,-our Christian faith.

We wish to make it clear that the Modernistic system of religion is not Christianity. The difference between Modernism and Fundamentalism is not merely a difference of interpretation in the realm of Christian Theology; it is the death struggle of two irreconcilable, and mutually exclusive, systems of religion: Christianity and Idolatry. Modernism is a form of Humanism, and one of its basic tenets is the deification of man. The God of the Modernist is not the God of the Christian, is not the God revealed in the Bible, is not "Our Great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ." The late Dr. G. Campbell Morgan has well said, "Every form of religion which is based upon a denial of the God of revelation is idolatry. I am not now thinking about India, I am not thinking about China, I am not thinking about Africa. I am thinking about countries nominally Christian. . . . Idolatry today consists in an attempt to worship God while denying the finality of the unveiling of God that came in the personality of Jesus." The Word of God forbids the believer's tolerating idolatry, or being yoked with it. For this reason, churches across this land have withdrawn, and continue to withdraw, from religious systems such as the Northern Baptist Convention.

That explains the existence of churches in the Baptist denomination that are not linked with the Convention. These churches have felt the need for fellowship, and for mutual encouragement in the testimony they bear, and in the work to which they are devoted. They have recognized the evils and dangers inhering in a position of extreme isolation. We believe it is certainly possible for an individual to be a Christian, to be truly saved, and yet not be identified with any local church. However, we are convinced that such an individual

would deprive himself of much that he might enjoy in fellowship with other believers, and would circumscribe his sphere of usefulness. We hold that the same thing is true of a church. It may be a valid New Testament church and have fellowship with no other church anywhere, but in maintaining such an isolated position it will certainly deprive itself of many blessings, and limit its usefulness for the Lord. Hence, an Association of Churches.

### WHAT IS THE ASSOCIATION?

We give herewith the article by Dr. Ketcham which appeared in the Bulletin of September, 1944.

The General Association of Regular Baptist Churches is not a convention. It is a fellowship. It is an endeavor to get back to the oldfashioned ideals, policies and practices of Baptists as they used to be.

The Association has a very simple constitution, and has as its basis of fellowship the truths expressed in the old New Hampshire Confession of Faith, with a premillennial interpretation of the last article.

In all of its activities, business is reduced to the minimum, and fellowship increased to the maximum.

It is the policy and aim of the Association to keep elaborate machinery out of the set up.

The time of the Association is taken up with great expositors of the Word of God; exaltations of the glorious Head of the Church and messages from the burning heart of missionaries, fresh from the front lines of world wide missionary endeavor. The aim shall always be to send every messenger home, not under a Sinai of debt to the bankers and money lenders, but rather under the debt of Calvary as expressed by Paul in Romans 1:14, namely, the debt we owe to get the gospel of salvation to the last heathen on the face of the earth.

This is an Association of churches. It has been felt wise to restrict the fellowship of this Association, so far as its voting power and official family is concerned, to such individuals as may be sent up to the annual meetings by local Baptist churches. There are advantages and disadvantages alike to be found in this procedure, but we believe the advantages outweigh the disadvantages. By adhering to this rule, the Association will know that every messenger present with voting power is there with the recom-

mendation of a local Baptist church back of him. Otherwise, any well meaning, but fly-by-night individual who signed the Constitution and Articles of Faith might endanger the balance and good sense of the body.

It is realized that this rule deprives the Association of the active voice and official help of scores of individual Baptist pastors and others, who, while themselves with us in heart, are either pastors of, or members in churches which are not in fellowship with the Association.

Let it be understood that any individual in the North whose heart yearns for the kind of fellowship as here set forth, and desires to meet with his brethren in the expressions of such a fellowship, is ten thousand times welcome to any and all of the meetings of the Association. The only time in which he will be made to feel any difference between himself and the brethren from the fellowshipping churches, will be in the very few brief moments allotted to business. Aside from that, the enjoyment of the fellowship is open to all who may desire it.

# WHO CONTROLS THE G. A. R. B. C.?

The General Association of Regular Baptist Churches North is now twelve years old. It has grown from an original group of less than fifty churches to its present number of 352.

It is well at this time to restate the constitutional provisions and the constituted policies of the Association. In 1932 and 33 discussions and conferences were held preparatory to the final adoption of the constitution which took place in 1934. In these conferences and discussions it was recognized that one of the inherent weaknesses of the old Baptist Bible Union was the fact that it was an organization of individuals. Any individual who signed the confession of faith was thereby immediately admitted to full membership and privileges in the union. Every man came on his own recommendation and the result was that many came who never in the world would have been sent up to the Convention by any responsible Baptist church. In the founding of the G. A. R. B. C. it was felt that this weakness should be guarded against and that the fellowship and control of the new

Association should be in the hands of local churches instead of in the hands of self-appointed individuals. Therefore, it was decided that the Association should be a fellowship of churches. Each fellowshipping church in the Association, regardless of the size of its membership has the privilege of sending up to the annual conference, six of its members as messengers. When these messengers arrive it is assumed that the local church of which they are a member had confidence enough in them to send them as their messengers and therefore, the Association accepts them and they have the privilege of the floor, voting privileges, and the privilege of holding office. This provision safeguards the Association from some of the evils which befell the Baptist Bible Union.

There is no president, vice president, secretary and treasurer, etc., in the G. A. R. B. C. elected annually by the ordinary process of some "appointed" nominating committee, presenting a list of names for the approval of the body. This system has always provided for political wire-pulling in the appointment of a nominating committee. which in turn could be trusted to bring in the "proper" recommendations. Seldom, if ever, is the report of such a nominating committee changed by the electing body. It is a safe wager that those nominated will be elected. To overcome this possibility of political engineering and to forever safeguard the General Association against any such maneuvering for place and power in the Association, at the suggestion of this editor at the meeting in Waterloo in 1938, the Constitution was amended to read as it now stands. Instead of the usual list of "officers" elected in the above described manner, there is a council of fourteen men elected. seven each year serving for a term of two years. These fourteen men are all on a par with each other. The Association does not name one of them the president, and one of them something else. The council itself organizes with a chairman of the council, but this does not make him president of the Association. He may or may not preside at the public meetings of the Association. but if he does it is in no sense to be interpreted that he is the "president" of anything.

This council of fourteen men is formed and elected in the following democratic manner. Several weeks

prior to the annual conference, the secretary of the Council of Fourteen sends to every fellowshipping church, a copy of the Constitution, calling their attention to the provisions for the nomination and election of the council and urging them to exercise their privilege as a fellowshipping church. Each church has the privilege of sending to the secretary of the Council, a list of nominations for the seven councilors whose terms will expire at the annual conference. Each church may send one name or a hundred names as nominees. As these names come into the office of the secretary of the Council each name is listed and every time that name occurs in some other church's ballot of nomination, it is so indicated opposite his name. Two weeks before the annual conference nominations are "closed." The names which have come in with their individual tallies are counted by the secretary of the Council and a record made of every name presented, and the number of times it was presented. The fifteen highest are then placed on a ballot. The ballot is taken to the annual conference, where seven of the fifteen are elected.

This election of the Council takes place in the following manner. Each fellowshipping church of the Association, before their messengers leave home. designates two of its messengers to act on the elections committee. Every church is entitled to two members, regardless of the size of the church. These messengers coming from the churches and sent there by the churches specifically for the business of electing the Council, gather together at which time they are presented with the ballot carrying the names of the fifteen nominees. The secretary of the council has with him upon every occasion, all of the original nominations sent in by the fellowshipping churches and they are rlaced on a table for the examination of any one who wishes to look them over. Thus his listing of the fifteen is open to check at any time by a committee or by any individual, or by the group as a whole if they so desire. After prayer the messengers from the churches proceed to mark their ballots and the seven highest out of the fifteen are declared elected for a term of two years to the council. Last year at Grand Rapids there were over three hundred messengers from churches who quietly and prayerfully took the nominations which

AMERICAN COUNCIL REPRESENTA TIVES

R. T. Ketcham C. E. Mason Jr. H. O. Van Gilder R. L. Ryerse had come up from the churches and proceeded as messengers of the churches to elect seven men to the Council.

We believe that this procedure is Baptistic, democratic, and safe. For the life of us we do not know how any mortal man would proceed to get himself elected under the provisions of this Constitution. His election must rest upon the final voice and vote of the churches, both in nomination and election. His succession in office year after year or even a single term is not determined by some favorable nominating committee who sees to it that he is one of the annual nominees.

# HOW TO ENTER THE FELLOWSHIP

The constitution provides that any Baptist church in the North, which is no longer in fellowship or cooperation with the Northern Baptist Convention, or its affiliates (whether this lack of fellowship and cooperation has been expressed by actual vote of the church, or by no longer practicing fellowship and cooperation) and which subscribes to the Constitution and Confession of Faith of the Association, and signifies in writing its desire to find fellowship with the Association, may be received into the fellowship. Mark you — not membership. A Baptist church cannot be a member of anything outside of itself. It can declare itself in fellowship with any body of Baptists on earth, but it cannot be a member.

# CONSTITUTION AND ARTICLES OF FAITH

Article I. Name.

General Association of Regular Baptist Churches (North).

#### Article II. Purpose.

To spread the Gospel, advance Baptist missionary enterprises, promote evangelism and provide Fellowship for Baptist Churches. (This statement governs the policy of the Association only, and in no wise makes mandatory any like policy in any fellowshipping church).

#### Article III. Meetings.

A meeting of the Association shall be held annually for the transaction of business, the election of officers and the conducting of a Bible and

Missionary Conference at a date and place to be fixed by the Council.

#### Article IV. Fellowship and Voting Privileges

Section 1. Any Baptist Church in the North which is no longer in Fellowship or in cooperation with the Northern Baptist Convention auxiliaries and its subscribes to the Constitution and Articles of Faith herein contained, and signifies in writing its desire to be considered in Fellowship with the Association, may, upon such written notice, be received into the Fellowship by a majority vote of the Association. Such notice of the church's desire shall be presented to the Secretary of the Association by the clerk of the Church.

Section 2. Each Church shall be entitled to a maximum of six voting messengers at the Annual meeting, two of whom shall be empowered to sit on the Elections Committee, but each Church is urged to send as many non-voting messengers as possible. Each year every voting messenger shall subscribe to the Constitution and Articles of Faith of the Association, prior to taking his seat in the annual meeting.

Section 3. No salaried servant of the Association shall be entitled to vote.

# Article V. Officers and Their Election.

Section 1. The officers of the Association shall consist of a Council of fourteen men (pastors or laymen of Fellowshipping churches) seven of whom shall be elected for one year and seven for two years. Seven shall be elected annually thereafter to serve for two years. Council members who cease to be members of fellowshipping churches shall fill out their unexpired terms (exceptions to the rule being determined by the council) but shall not be eligible for re-election until affiliated with a fellowshipping church.

Section 2. The Council shall appoint annually the editor of the official organ and the Secretary-Treasurer of the Association.

Section 3. The Council shall meet at the annual conference immediately after its election and shall appoint from its own body individuals to care for the various matters relative to the work of the Association, such as missions, publications, programs, enrollment, etc.

The Council may appoint sectional representatives. These representatives may or may not be members of the Council.

Section 4. The Council shall be elected in the following manner: Each church in Fellowship with the Association shall meet in business session and nominate as many names for the Council as it may desire. These names shall be sent to the Secretary of the Association at least two weeks in advance of the annual meeting. The secretary will make proper tabulation of all lists and the fifteen highest names shall be considered the nominees. Each church in Fellowship with the Association shall designate two of its messengers to serve on the committee of election, which two shall consist either of the pastor and a layman, or two laymen. At an announced time during the annual conference, at the call of the secretary, this committee shall meet at which time the list of fifteen nominees shall be presented to it and each member shall select seven. The seven highest shall be considered elected to the Council.

Section 5. The Council shall appoint one of its members to act as Moderator of the public meetings of the Association. It shall also appoint one of its members as chairman of the Council.

#### Article VI. Amendments.

This Constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting.

## ARTICLES OF FAITH

#### I. Of The Scriptures

We believe that the Holy Bible as originally written was verbally inspired and the product of Spirit-controlled men, and therefore has truth without any admixture of error for its matter. We believe the Bible to be the true center of Christian union and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and opinions, shall be tried.

#### II. Of The True God

We believe there is one, and only one, living and true God, an infinite Spirit, the Maker and Supreme Ruler of heaven and earth; inexpressively glorious in holiness, and worthy of all possible honor,

confidence and love; that in the unity of the Godhead there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, equal in every divine perfection, and executing distinct but harmonious offices in the great work of redemption.

Exodus 20:2-3; I Corinthians 8:6; Revelation 4:11; I John 5:7.

#### III. Of The Holy Spirit

We believe that the Holy Spirit is a divine person; with God the Father and God the Son and of the same nature; that He was active in the creation; that in His relation to the unbelieving world He restrains the evil one until God's purpose is fulfilled; that He convicts of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment; that He bears witness to the Truth of the Gospel in preaching the testimony: that He is the agent in the New Birth; that He seals, endues, guides, teaches, witnesses, sanctifies and helps the believer.

#### IV. Of The Devil, Or Satan

We believe in the personality of Satan, that he is the unholy god of this age, and author of all the powers of darkness, and is destined to the judgment of an eternal justice in the lake of fire.

#### V. Of The Creation

We accept the Genesis account of creation and believe that man came by direct creation of God and not by evolution.

Genesis, chapters 1 and 2; Col. 1:16-17; John 1:3.

#### VI. Of The Fall Of Man

We believe that man was created in innocence under the law of his Maker, but by voluntary transgression fell from his sinless and happy state in consequence of which all mankind are now sinners, not only by constraint, but of choice; and therefore under just condemnation without defense or excuse.

#### VII. Of The Virgin Birth

We believe that Jesus was begotten of the Holy Ghost in a miraculous manner; born of Mary, a virgin, as no other man was ever born or can ever be born of woman, and that He is both the Son of God, and God, the Son.

#### VIII. Of The Attonement For Sin

We believe that the salvation of sinners is wholly of grace; through the mediatorial offices of the Son of God, who by the appointment of the Father, freely took upon Him our nature, yet without sin, honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and by His death made a full and vicarious atonement for our sins; that His atonement consisted not in setting us an example by His death as a martyr, but was a voluntary substitution of Himself in the sinner's place, the Just dying for the unjust; Christ, the Lord, bearing our sins in His own body on the tree; that having risen from the dead. He is now enthroned in Heaven, and uniting in His wonderful person the tenderest sympathies with divine perfection, He is in every way qualified to be a suitable, a compassionate and an allsufficient Savior.

#### IX. Of Grace In The New Creation

We believe that in order to be saved, sinners must be born again; that the new birth is a new creation in Christ Jesus; that it is instantaneous and not a process; that in the new birth the one dead in trespasses and in sins is made a partaker of the divine nature and receives eternal life, the free gift of God: that the new creation is brought about in a manner above our comprehension, solely by the power of the Holy Spirit in connection with divine truth, so as to secure our voluntary obedience to the gospel; that its proper evidence appears in the holy fruits of repentance and faith and newness of

John 3:3; II Cor. 5:17; I John 5:1; John 3:6-7; Acts 16:30-33; II Peter 1:4; Rom. 6:23; Eph. 2:1; II Cor. 5:19; Col. 2:13; John 3:8.

### X. Of Justification

We believe that the great gospel blessing which Christ secures to such as believe in Him is Justification;

- (a) That Justification includes the pardon of sin, and the gift of eternal life on principles of righteousness;
- (b) That it is bestowed not in consideration of any works of right-eousness which we have done; but solely through faith in the redeemer's blood. His righteousness is imputed to us.

#### XI. Of Faith And Salvation

We believe that faith in the Lord Jesus Christ is the only condition of salvation.

#### XII. Of The Local Church

We believe that a local church is a congregation of immersed believers, associated by covenant of faith and fellowship of the Gospel; observing the ordinances of Christ; governed by His laws; and exercising the gifts, rights and privileges invested in them by His word; that its officers are pastors, and deacons whose qualifications, claims, and duties are clearly defined in the Scriptures; we believe the true Mission of the church is the faithful witnessing of Christ to all men as we have opportunity. We hold that the local church has the absolute right of self-government, free from the inheritance of any hierarchy of individuals or organizations; and that the one and only super-intendent is Christ, through the Holy Spirit; that it is scriptural for true churches to co-operate with each other in contending for the faith and for the furtherance of the Gospel; that each local church is the sole judge of the measure and methods of its co-operation; on all matters of membership, of polity, of government, of discipline, of benevolence, the will of the local church is final.

# XIII. Of Baptism And The Lord's Supper

We believe that Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in

water to show forth in a solemn and beautiful emblem our faith in the crucified, buried and risen Savior, with its effect in our death to sin and resurrection to a new life; that it is pre-requisite to the privileges of a church relation. We believe that the Lord's Supper is the commemoration of His death until He come, and should be preceded always by solemn self-examination.

# XIV. Of The Security Of The Saints

We believe that all who are truly born again are kept by God the Father for Jesus Christ.

# XV. Of The Righteous And The Wicked

We believe that there is a radical and essential difference between the righteous and the wicked; that such only as through faith are justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, and sanctified by the Spirit of our God, are truly righteous in His esteem; while all such as continue in impenitence and unbelief are in His sight wicked, and under the curse; and this distinction holds among men both in and after death, in the everlasting felicity of the saved and the everlasting conscious suffering of the lost.

#### XVI. Of Civil Government

We believe that civil government is of divine appointment, for the interests and good order of human society; that magistrates are to be prayed for, conscientiously honored, and obeyed; except in things opposed to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ who is the only Lord of the conscience, and the coming Prince of the Kings of the earth.

# XVII. Of The Resurrection, Personal, Visible, Pre-millennial Return Of Christ, And Related Events

#### NEW CHURCHES

Up to the time of going to press 59 churches have applied for fellowship with our Association. Of these, 19 have not yet been voted upon by the churches of the Fellowship, but if they were included it would make the total of fellowshipping churches exactly 352.

Needless to say, we cordially welcome these churches, not only to share our fellowship, but to share our testimony.

We now have churches in each of the following states: Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Washington, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

### MISSIONARY GIVING HITS NEW HIGH

Last year 199 churches reported gifts for Missions totalling \$444,523.02. On the basis of membership this meant a per capita giving for those churches to the cause of Missions of \$10.04.

Peculiarly enough, the number of churches which, up to this time, have reported their missionary gifts this year is exactly the same—199. This year, however, the gifts totalled \$547,168.82, or a per capita giving of \$13.59.

Eleven churches achieved the dis-

tinction of actually giving more to Missions than to current expenses.

Again, therefore, our annual report proves that when Baptists who love the Lord are convinced that their missionary money will be used for His glory, and for the winning of souls, they will give without any campaign, "movements," or external pressure. Of the other 153 churches on the roster, nineteen applied for fellowship too late for their statistics to be included in our report. We hope that the 134 churches which have not yet sent us their missionary report will do so before the end of the year.

DES MOINES: The Grace Baptist church has called Rev. Henry Van Kommer, formerly of the South St. Paul Baptist Church, Minnesota, as its pastor. Twenty-two souls have already been baptized, and a total of thirty-three have been added to the membership. A building program is under way, designed to provide two additional Sunday School rooms, kitchen, pastor's study, and a beautiful baptistry. Building improvements have already gone over the thousand dollar mark. missionary interest and offerings have increased, and the church is eagerly awaiting God's leading in sending a missionary for them to support. The entire Sunday School offering each Sunday now goes to missions, and has increased from ten dollars per Sunday to thirtyfive. The offerings of the church have increased proportionately.

Their Summer Bible School had an enrollment of 136 children and 18 teachers. The Fireside Chat, an after-church young people's fellowship, has proved a great blessing, one soul already having been saved.

MUSCATINE: Rev. Esmond C. Lasswell read his resignation to the Walnut Street Baptist Church on Sunday, July 1st, announcing his acceptance of a unanimous call to become the pastor of the First Baptist Church of Eldora, Iowa. He is to assume the duties of his new pastorate on September 1st.

He reports that during the pastorate in Muscatine, all departments of the church have shown steady growth in attendance, spiritual interest and giving. Perhaps the greatest growth has been in the matter of missionary giving, which has increased 300 per cent. The building has been completely redecorated and improvements add-It is being left by Brother Lasswell entirely free from debt and in good financial condition. Many souls have been saved and added to the church during his stay in Muscatine, a city of approximately twenty thousand. Brother Lasswell was used of the Lord to or-Southeastern the Towa Youth for Christ, and has been its

director since its inception. He has also sponsored and carried on the monthly city-wide Singspiration.

CORWITH: Pastor Albert Rust, who has the seldom equalled record of carrying on a successful and aggressive pastorate in a town of under five hundred population tor over sixteen years, reports that in recent days God has granted them the great joy of baptizing thirteen believers, all of whom gave testimony at their regular service of having the assurance of salvation. The special joy to a pastor's heart was the fact that three of these were his own children, and all except three were of high school age. He reports that others are awaiting baptism.

Something of Pastor Rust's aggressiveness is seen in the fact that he has opened an additional new work in a county seat town of 3,700 population where there was no Baptist testimony. Some fifty people were in attendance at each of the first two Sunday services.

HORTON: The pastor of the Horton Baptist Church, Rev. Robert G. Gardner, served this year as state chairman of the Young People's Christian Life Camp at Clear Lake, and was re-elected chairman for next year. A number of young people from this church attended the camp.

The Sunday school of the Horton church is sponsoring a work at Six Mile Grove, which is under the direction of Rev. Charles Olmstead, a recent graduate of the Northwestern Bible Seminary, Minneapolis, Minn. He and Mrs. Olmstead assisted Rev. Gardner in conducting a Summer Bible School at Horton. The school ran for two weeks with an average attendance of 88.

WATERLOO: The blessing of God upon the ministry of Dr. R. T. Ketcham in the Walnut Street Baptist Church is indicated in a personal word to his people in their weekly church paper. Writing to his people, Dr. Ketcham says:

"As we near the end of our sixth

year with you dear ones, a flood of memories come trooping through our heart and mind. They are memories which cause us to bow in humble thanksgiving to God for their pleasantness and happiness. You have truly been a wonderful people. I only wish I had been as good a pastor as you have a people. Your amazing loyalty in your response to my appeals could well be the envy of every pastor on this continent. Your thoughtfulness for my comfort and that of my family constitutes a debt of gratitude which I can never repay. Your patience with me in my physical handicap of poor eyesight is tender and understanding. Your genuine support of me in the tremendous responsibilities which the Lord has laid upon me in my ministry for the wider cause of Christ, reaching around the world, has not gone unnoticed or unappreciated by me, nor by the multiplied thousands outside of this church who have benefited from your generosity in sharing my time.

"In preparing statistics looking forward to the Fiftieth Anniversary of this Church next year, the following facts are revealed covering these six years of ministry with vou. Let it be understood that I em in no sense taking the credit for much of those results. No one is more keenly aware than I that much, if not most, of these results have been brought about because of foundations laid and superstructures built by my predecessors. I simply list those facts here in order that we may rejoice together in God's blessing upon us in these six years together. These figures and facts ought not only to cause us to rejoice, but to be utterly broken down in humble thanksgiving to God who has been pleased to use pastors and people as instruments in His hand to accomplish His purposes.

"During these six years, nineteen have actually entered training and graduated from training schools. Seven have actually gone to the foreign field. Five more will be on their way before the end of December, the Lord willing. Six-

teen have gone out to be pastors and pastor's wives. Seven have been ordained by this church, whom were already three of preaching prior to six years ago. Four others have been ordained by other churches, of which they became pastors after graduation. Three have become church secretaries. One has gone out to teach in a Baptist orphanage. All of these figures involve forty-three individuals, seven of whom were either in training or active service prior to six years ago. Thank God for this small army of young lives recruited from this cnurch for His blessed service, all within the last six years or a little prior thereto. The records are being searched and information secured, and a list will be published of those who have gone into full-time service before the period mentioned above.

"We would not forget, too, to thank God for the fine army of young people who are living daily consecrated lives for the Lord Jesus right here in Walnut Street. Those who "stay by the stuff" will share equally with those who "go to battle," providing that is God's plan for their life.

"Another cause for humble thanksgiving, as we take the backward look, is God's faithfulness to us in permitting us to be able to give during these six years (or the little over five and one-half of them already passed), \$87,765.24 to missions, (by the end of the fiscal year, this will easily reach \$100,000). Also \$110,560.14 has been given for local expense, or a total of \$198,325.38. And all of this by the purely voluntary system of offerings on the Lord's Day.

"We humbly thank God also for the 562 individuals who have walked the aisles in this church making public confession of saving faith in the Lord Jesus.

"It is with hearts lifted up to Him in praise, and with spirits humbled before the mighty God that we say "Thank you" to the Lord and to you, the Lord's people, for these precious six years."
